COMMUNITY

Satellite High School is located on the east coast of Central Florida in the city of Satellite Beach. This beachside community consists of approximately 10,000 residents. The school serves Satellite Beach, Indian Harbour Beach, Patrick Air Force Base, the southern tip of Merritt Island and the unincorporated area of South Patrick Shores. Satellite HS is one of the 14 comprehensive senior high schools in Brevard County. The school district is the 66th largest district in the nation and is recognized as a state and national leader in academic excellence. Brevard County is the ninth largest county in population in the state. Our community continues to grow as a result of the Kennedy Space Center and numerous electronic and other high technology industries in the area.

THE SCHOOL

Satellite High School (SHS) opened in the Fall of 1962 and graduated its first senior class in the Spring of 1963. SHS is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and is recognized as one of the most outstanding high schools in Brevard County.

SHS houses grades nine through twelve and has a student population of 1200, consisting of 325

freshmen, 290 sophomores, 285 juniors and 305 seniors. Distribution of the students by racial/ethnic group is as follows:

SHS has a dropout rate of less than 1%.

CURRICULUM

SHS offers Honors classes in all academic areas. Advanced Placement Classes available to students include: English Language; English Literature; Environmental Science; Calculus; Statistics; American History; Government; Psychology; World History; Music Theory; Studio Art; Spanish Language; Biology and European History.

Students in grades 10 through 12, who are ready to pursue college-level work while still in high school, may do so through Brevard Community College Dual Enrollment. Dual Enrollment students earn high school credit and free college credit at the same time.

The Collegiate High School Program allows students to graduate high school with both a Satellite High School diploma and a university-transfer Associate in Arts degree from Brevard Community College.

Satellite High School provides specialized programs for students in the Fine Arts Academy, exceptional education, gifted studies and science research. A variety of electives are provided in music, art, vocational education, technology and world languages.
